Dave Patterson, Saturn Power, requested a municipal Council resolution or agreement in support of a 10,000 kW ground-mounted solar project at 30705 Highway 48 in Pefferlaw which would create 100 full-time jobs on a 60 acre site

Karen Wolfe expressed her concerns with a proposed indemnification bylaw which would permit the municipality to use taxpayer's dollars to initiate defamation lawsuits and expressed her concerns that the proposed by-law would eliminate free speech, public participation and democracy.

Mark Donald, Counsel representing Karen Wolfe, advising that it is opinion that this proposed by-law in its present form unlawfully stifles free press in a democratic society and freedom of expression, noting that no government may commence a defamation action against a private individual.

Michael Smith of Michael Smith Planning Consultants, advised that he is in attendance respecting Item No. 12(2)(H) and Item No. 12(2)(P) to answer any questions that may arise.

(C) Indemnification By-law and Procedure

Report No. DAS-2015-0039

John Espinosa, Town Clerk, provided a summary of the report at this time.

- •The Town has errors and omissions insurance coverage and the proposed by-law would 'fill any gaps' by offering and providing coverage to employees, Council members, etc, acting in their official capacity and who find themselves not covered by insurance.
- •There is a difference between robust political discourse, fair criticism and defamation against an individual. Defamation is not free speech.

Winanne Grant, CAO, advised that it is normal for a municipality to have an indemnification bylaw to eliminate gaps in coverage for staff.

Michel Bigioni responding to Mark Donald's remarks indicating that there is case law within the last few years that makes it clear that governmental institutions have the ability to agree to underwrite costs; it is legal for a municipality to agree to pick up the costs of those court proceedings.

John Espinisa advised that The Protection of Public Interest Act, Bill 83, received 2nd reading in 2014, and it has been referred to a Standing Committee on Social Policy. This Bill would prevent individuals from suing for defamation in order to stifle them; one must prove their case for defamation.

In staff's review, the land does not meet the LRP Program Agricultural Land Use Restriction test and even if it did meet the test, Council is not obliged to support the project.
